

A.C. Frieden Researches Key Sites in Poland

KRAKOW/OSWIECIM, Poland (Sep. 22, 2007) – Chicago-based author A.C. Frieden arrived in Krakow to begin his onsite research for two upcoming mystery novels, including the sequel to his 2006 thriller *Tranquility Denied*. Accompanied by two attorney colleagues, Frieden visited several sites in Krakow's Old Town and also traveled to Osweicim to tour the Auschwitz and Birkenau concentration camps.
