

Author A.C. Frieden Visits Sweden and Denmark for Literary Projects

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (May 20, 2009) – A.C. Frieden traveled to Sweden and Denmark to work on two literary projects: a sequel to his thriller *Tranquility Denied* (also set partly in Stockholm) and an aerial photography book. “Stockholm and Copenhagen are beautiful capitals with important roles in regional and international politics,” Frieden said. In Stockholm and Goteborg, Sweden, and in Copenhagen, Denmark, Frieden toured many security- and military-related sites and conducted special research activities that will become clearer when his sequel is released in 2010. Frieden also visited a bookstore in central Stockholm, where his latest novels are on sale.
